





Farewell to the Puffins Fundraiser Boat Tour - 2023

I first want to take a moment to say a BIG **THANK YOU** for embarking on our annual "Farewell to the Puffins" fundraising event with us! It was so nice to see the skies a bit clearer after the recent haze the smoke from nearby wildfires had brought us. Though we had some rolling, rougher waters out near Smith, it was a beautiful evening on the water. Pushing out of Skyline Marina, the group's excitement was palpable and set a tone of excitement for the evening. I couldn't wait to see what the trip would bring us. Below you will find the route that Outer Island's Blackfish IV embarked upon during our trip, with call out areas and corresponding silhouetted species (I'll dive into details throughout the report!).






Beginning the Evening - Williamson Rocks, Cormorants, & Channel Marker Pinnipeds



We had our heading (Smith Island), aimed to find Tufted Puffins, but there is always other wildlife to be seen along the way.

Williamson Rocks is a great spot to stop when heading south from Skyline and typically yields gulls, seabirds, and the most common pinniped in the Salish Sea: the harbor seal. Here, we have a small sampling of what we saw as we slowly slipped by.

The lighting in the evenings in late August can be absolute magic and we witnessed it on this trip. The almost golden cast makes for lovely photos, but also for spotting the details on our feathered friends that we may not always be able to see in stark/contrasting sunlight or on "gray days."

Between Williamson Rocks and the red channel marker to the south, we easily picked up this region's 3 cormorant species. Some pelagic cormorant chicks can be seen in this photo.

Smith Island - Tufted Puffins & Alcid Friends

Stopping by a bait ball that was largely a mixed flock of gulls, we were all getting anxious. Just a few more miles and our search for the coveted, football-sized alcids really picked up. Skirting around Minor Island so we could make the turn back north on the southwest side of Smith, Captain Brock was positioning the boat to put the sun behind us, giving us the best chances of picking up the bold white and orange on the tufted puffins' faces. And low and behold, after some decent scanning effort, we finally found our first puffin of the evening!

Not long after, we also spotted the rare Horned Puffin! I'm so excited that s/he was out there—I know that was a "life bird" (first time seeing this species) for a lot of people onboard!

Again, the lighting was just magnificent. Denim blue water, and the golden highlights on these birds was nothing shy of swoon-worthy.













As always, we breathe a sigh of relief when we have located Tufted Puffins on this tour—with the cherry-on-top being the rare Horned Puffin. Making our way back north, and along the east side of Lopez island, there was one last rocky outcropping to visit—Bird Rocks. Aptly named, there was a snow globe of activity there, as well as a few surprises! One surprise which I didn't even realize we had "seen" until I looked through my photos!











Crossing the strait to head into the marina, I turned around to find this gorgeous sunset. This FUNdraiser trip was such a wonderful way to wind down our summer season on the water—especially amongst you all, the community that supports our initiatives! We hope you had a great experience—let's share some more time adventuring out on the beautiful Salish Sea, soon!




